Paul's Message

As the year comes closer to the holiday season it's a good time to look back at some of the 2015 highlights. For the Foundation, no two years are ever the same, but there are some repeating themes.



The state of our funds in trust is something we regularly review, as the greater these assets are the more we can support our local community through our annual grant round. So it was with great excitement we announced at the beginning of the year that we had reached the magic figure of \$1 million. There was a sense in which the Foundation had come of age; no longer were we one of the smallest community foundations in the country. Shortly after that announcement we were delighted to be able to report that two super-generous donors had each contributed \$100,000 to the Foundation. So we are well on the way to the next benchmark figure of \$2 million, which we hope to reach before the end of 2017.

At the end of last year and the beginning of this we entered into the retail business, with two fine products – the Essence of Buderim lifestyle book and the Foundation Shiraz red wine. With strong sales early on, we have reached the point where almost all the wine has gone to good homes. And there are just sufficient books to meet the anticipated Xmas demand. Each product has contributed significantly to the trust funds and piqued our interest in the value of the Buderim Foundation brand.

Good News Night again this year was a wonderful affair, with nearly 20 organisations in receipt of grants, with the largest grant of \$6700 going to that great community resource CareFlight. Good News Night is always such a wonderful event that we want to make sure that as many people as possible are able to attend. We think that a Friday evening may not be the most convenient time for a family event, so we are intending to hold the 2016 event on a Sunday afternoon.

This year we have been in receipt of grants as well as giving them out. The Sunshine Coast Council has provided us with a grant of \$5000 under the Community Partnerships program. And we are one of just two community foundations nationally (the Border Trust in NSW is the other) to receive a grant from the Foundation for Rural and Regional Recovery under the

new Community and Philanthropy Partnerships Week, which is the second week in December. The grant of \$7000 will enable us to join with the BWMCA to produce and distribute a major new publication called Spirit of Buderim; it is great that these two local organisations can each prepare material which identifies both our individual roles and the cooperative way we are able to contribute to Buderim through our partnership. A special thanks to Lisa Edward who has become principal grant writer for the Foundation's Board!

At GNN in September we farewelled two long-standing Board members and welcomed three more. Leanne Evans was a key driver when the Foundation was being established and had been a Board member ever since. She has been the mainstay in the grants program but has contributed across our full spectrum of operations, and will continue to serve on our Youth committee. Swain Roberts brought a deep passion for philanthropy to the Board and was chair of the Fund Development committee. He also was the Board's representative as we worked with Council to establish Stuart Weir Place and the public art that is now placed there. We thank them both for their major contributions. And we welcome Gary Dillon, Cheryl Ryan and John Kruger to the Board and look forward to their contributions.

And finally it has been such a great pleasure to welcome our newest sponsor Sunshine Toyota and dealer principal Darren Venning, who join Buderim Pharmacy and EdenLea on Buderim as our three sponsors. It is their contributions to our operating costs that enable us to pass every dollar of donation or bequest directly into trust. We thank them very much.

There are too many people who assist the Foundation for me to thank them individually. So to our Members, Ambassadors, donors, committee members, special skill providers, Board members and anyone not already classified, thank you for helping us make Buderim a better place for us all.

"I am excited about working locally with the community through the Buderim Foundation. Wherever you can make a difference," Cheryl said.




